Provenance has an editorial board that includes representatives from:

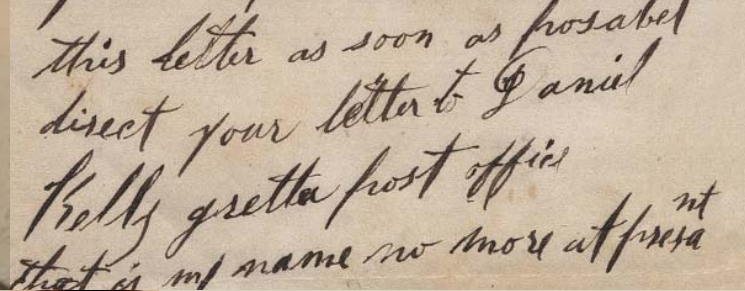
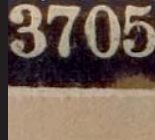

Introduction

Provenance is a free online scholarly journal published annually by Public Record Office Victoria (PROV). It aims to represent the full spectrum of research interests that can be satisfied using PROV's archival holdings, and invites contributions from all disciplines.

Articles on any subject are welcome; however, to be eligible for publication in *Provenance*, submissions must include either research that uses original records held by PROV or research that contributes to a better understanding of PROV's resources.

Provenance informs readers about Victoria's history and cultural heritage. It also seeks to serve as an inspiration to readers wishing to make their own way into the archive by retracing the steps of other researchers with similar interests.

Peer-reviewed articles

Peer review

Provenance features peer-reviewed articles on a wide range of subjects. Peer review is a process whereby submissions are reviewed by two referees who have relevant research expertise.

Publication in the journal will depend on the overall assessment of the proposed article by both peer reviewers.

DEST register and points

The journal has been included in the register of refereed journals maintained by the Commonwealth Department of Education, Science and Training (DEST). Peer-reviewed articles accepted for publication in the journal are eligible for DEST points.

Forum section

The Forum section of the journal is open to a variety of submissions, including case studies, personal histories, research notes, and other contributions based substantially on archives in PROV's collection. This section of *Provenance* seeks to publish informal pieces that are nonetheless engaging, informative, well researched and well written.

All submissions to this section are reviewed by the editorial board.
